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Information about the place



The venue of the Congress will be the San Lorenzo da Brindisi International College, managed by the Capuchin Friars Minor. It is a modern complex suitable for large events, with a spacious conference room, several smaller rooms and chapels, as well as an outdoor area. The entire building, near Ciampino airport, is air conditioned.

Number of seats

The maximum number of people that can be accommodated is approximately 200. Many of the rooms will be double. Probably a maximum of 50 participants will be able to have single rooms. The ideal would be to have at least 150 people.



Costs

Euro 55 per day for room and board for each. It will be the same for single and double rooms.



Definitely

Breakfast (from 7.30 to 9.00), lunch at 1.00 and dinner at 8.00. Coffee break yet to be determined. We can ask an agency to provide snacks, etc. but the cheapestthing would be to buy some food products and provide them to theparticipants. Special diets can be planned upon request. In one evening, an outdoor dinner will be organized in the courtyard. If a particular cultural group wishes to cook their own food, kitchens are available. If a day trip is planned, we will be provided with food to take with us.





Information about the place



Trasport

There is a bus service every 15 minutes leaving from a point opposite the retreatcentre. It goes to Cornelia and then from there you can take a bus or the metro to reach the city center. It would be appropriate to pick up most people at the airport. Some may come alone by taxi (taxi fare from Fiumicino is around 30 euros.), but mostparticipants may need help. One possibility is to hire one or two known taxis toorganize we based on arrival and departure times. The Franciscans have one or two minibuses that can be hired to transport people.



Chapels

A large chapel and 3 or 4 small chapels, to use them.



Other useful things

We will have to provide enough water because it will be hot. There is the possibility of washing clothes if someone wants to do it. Internet is available for free. Live streaming of the plenary meetings.... for those who cannot be physically present.



Inspiration

The inspiration for this program came from the 24th chapter of the Gospel according to Luke, in which we read about the disciples going to Emmaus. The disciples, during a dialogue on the journey, share their disappointment and meet Jesus, whom they recognize in the breaking of the bread. This experience of God allows them to see reality from a different and hopeful perspective. We want the IV Congress of the Union of the Catholic Apostolate to be precisely this type of experience: the experience of a journey during which we will renew our joy in meeting God and others, and we will recognize the hope that comes from the Resurrection.

Congress theme:

With Christ, our hope, we set out again together with joy and courage renewed.

You are witnesses of these. (Lk 24,48)

Hope

It is our deep desire that Congress participants can experience what the disciples experienced on the road to Emmaus. A profound change of heart that rediscovers the hope that comes from the encounter with Jesus.



Community

We want participants to experience the journey of being in community, together. It is important that this pilgrimage is not only spiritual, but that, through a symbolic walk-through Rome, one experiences the effort of being and walking together.



Dynamics

Through a varied programme, we want to ensure an appropriate structure, which ensures that the contents are presented in an interesting way and that participants can maintain the necessary attention and energy.



Relationship building

By working in smaller linguistic groups, we would like the Congress to become an opportunity to forge new relationships that will result in mutual prayer, cooperation and - we hope - common projects in the future.

The path



Day 3

During the day, participants will have the opportunity to open their hearts towhat is difficult, to disappointment like that felt by the disciples on the journey to Emmaus. They should be in the truth, accepting what is painful on a personal level and the difficulties that affect the family of the Union.



Day 4

The experience of God and the experience of community, when we emerge from our isolation, allows participants to recognize what is important and to rejoice in it.



Day 5

Participants will be led to experience the depth of the encounter with Christwho, by opening their hearts, is able to make their expectations real, helping them overcome difficulties and restoring their hope.



Day 6

Participants who have the courage to face their difficulties and hand them over to Christ regain hope and can return to everyday life, to the community and witnessthe joy of what filled their hearts.

Theme: With Christ, our hope, let us set out again together with renewed joy and courage.

You are witnesses of this. (Lk 24,48)

Day 3 (Saturday 27 July)

We must enter the kingdom of God through many tribulations.

During the day, participants are given the opportunity to open their hearts to what is difficult, to what represents their disappointment. They should be honest, addressing what they consider painful.



That same day two disciples were going to Emmaus, a village about eleven kilometers away from Jerusalem. Along the way they talked to each other about what had happened in Jerusalem in those days. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus approached and began walking with them. However, they did not recognize him, because their eyes were blinded. Jesus asked them: What are you discussing among yourselves as you walk? They then stopped, sad. (Lk24, 13-17)

What's happening now? At a personal, family, Union, Church, Nation, and world level. Where do you feel your hopes have not been realized as you desired in these contexts? Your hopes that Christ would change something, would make a difference. Where might there be a gap between what you hope Christ can do and His way and time of doing things? Testimony of some women - not believed have you had the experience of not seeing your testimony taken seriously? Have you been closed and deaf to the voice of God speaking through testimony?

Day 4 (Sunday 28 July)

Let's start again together

When we come out of our isolation, we recognize what is important: the experience of God, the experience of community... we can rejoice and bear witness to it.



At that moment the eyes of the two disciples opened and they recognized Jesus, but he disappeared from their sight. They said to each other, 'Didn't we feel like a fire in our hearts when he spoke to us along the way and explained the Bible to us?' (Lk 24, 31-32).



The disciples recognized the Lord in breaking the bread. This experience lit their hearts, wanting more and more. Man is an agglomeration of desires that do not allow himto stop.

Day 5 (Monday 28 July)

Christ, our hope, is beside us.

During the day, participants will experience the depth of the encounter with Christ who, by opening their hearts, is able to make their expectations real, help them experience difficulties and restore their hope.



Then Jesus said: 'You really understand little; how slow you are to believe what the prophets have written! Didn't the Messiah have tosuffer these things before entering his glory?' Then Jesus explained to the two disciples the passages of the Bible that concerned him. He began from the books of Moses up to the writings of all the prophets. Meanwhile they arrived at the village where they were headed, and Jesus pretended to continue the journey. But those two disciples held him back saying: 'Stay with us because the sun is now setting'. So Jesus, entered the village to stay with them. (Lk24, 25-30)

Christ's Response - Oh foolish men, so slow to believe all that the prophets have said. Wasn't it necessary for Christ to suffer before entering his glory? He explainedall the passages about himself in the Scriptures, starting with Moses. Wasn't it perhaps necessary, for us too, in the different contexts of our life and our world that Christ suffered before entering his glory?

Outside, around the cross, prepare an environment suitable for prayer. During the vigil you can present the candles representing the various continents and the card with the testimony of the young people, while praying for all the boys and girls in the world.

Day 6 (Tuesday 30 July)

With renewed joy and courage

Participants who have the courage to face their difficulties and hand them over to Christ regain hope and can return to their daily lives. As with the disciples of Emmaus, they recognize the importance of returning to the community, to those with whom they live their daily lives, to share the joy that Jesus has always walked with them and filled their gaps and inabilities.



Then they got up and immediately returned to Jerusalem. There, they found the eleven disciples gathered with their companions. These said: 'The Lord has truly risen andappeared to Simon.' In turn the two disciples told what had happened to them along the way and said that they had recognized him while he was breaking the bread (Lk 24,33-35).

Like the disciples, we all need to recognize that Jesus is among our relationships and this is the vital announcement of every community to which we return so that he lives among us, bringing Him to everyone, testifying to the beauty of the encounter with Christ to the whole world.
